General Information

Three Separate Divisions:

Immersion: 6th, 7th and 8th grades.

Middle School Division: 6th, 7th, 8th middle school students. Students in this division will compete separately from high school students except in the heritage recitation event and the 8th grade grammar exam. In order to compete in this division, students may NOT be enrolled in a course higher than Level I.

High School Division: Levels I, II, III, and Advanced.

Level I – first-year language students

Level II – second-year language students

Level III – third-year language students

Advanced – fourth-year and above language students

Passport to Success Stations

From 10:00am - 12:30pm students will have the opportunity to visit various stations. When they fulfill the conversational needs at each station, they will receive a stamp on their passport by a designated “Aduanero”. Upon getting all of the stamps in their passports, students can drop off their passport in the designated spot in the Awards location to be entered into a drawing to win a Grand Prize. The drawing will be held during the Encore Presentations and Awards Ceremony.

AATSP Membership
